For tens of thousands of African Americans the way to prison began in our nation's schools. In the Metro Nashville Schools black and minority students make up less than half of the student population, but they account for some three quarters of all expulsions and out-of-school suspensions

Working to halt the "school to prison pipeline," the Criminal Justice Task Force of NOAH (Nashville Organized for Action and Hope) asked the Board of Metro Nashville Public Schools to set up a committee to focus on racial disparities in school discipline. The Board agreed, and the "Community Engagement: Equity in School Discipline" committee will begin meeting in March. It will bring together board members, parents, teachers, students, and principals. This school-community partnership will give the Board genuine, ongoing insight into community concerns and allow it to play a constructive role in addressing racial disparities in school discipline.

NOAH has asked students, parents, and teachers to share their experiences with discipline in the Nashville schools at the meeting. Eric Brown of the Children's Defense Fund will show how school suspensions and expulsions factor into the pipeline. Lorraine Stallworth, MNPS Trainer in Restorative Practices, will talk about how the schools are using the principles of restorative justice in the classroom. - Len Walker
